Sergeant Shissler Update

Sergeant Shissler tells us the bad guys must be inside staying warm, because the Hampden Township Police Department has seen a decrease in their activity. But he still asks all of the township's residents to lock your doors so they do not take refuge in your house.

He reminds us that keeping the sidewalks clear of snow and ice is a township ordinance and not just the "right thing to do." Sidewalks that are not cleared in a timely manner can be very dangerous for kids going to school bus stops, the neighborhood walkers, the pets that need to be walked, etc. Be a good neighbor and make this a priority.

He also asks that you do not throw snow back onto the street when shoveling your driveway as this creates ice and piles of snow that will just end up on your neighbor's driveway when it gets plowed by the township plows.

Finally, he would like to remind us that identity theft is one of the major concerns at the township so use vigilance particularly when using your ATM or credit card. If you suspect any kind of theft, be sure to inform the police department and your bank.

Crosswalk Update

The Westover Civic Association continues to pursue the crosswalk over Skyport Road (not an elevated one, yikes!) The board has approached the township and since this will be crossing over a major road connecting Stephens Crossing and Westover Drive on both side of Westover development, it will require careful thought. The hoped-for crosswalk will consist of markings on the roadway and signage so that residents can safely cross over between the two sections of Westover without putting life and limb in jeopardy.

Electrical Service Panels Still in the News....

The Westover Civic Association continues to receive stories about fires and electrical hazards regarding the Zinsco electrical service panels installed in the older section of Westover. We can only stress that you get these panels checked immediately as they are a fire and safety hazard. The underlying problem is that the breakers "stick" in the "on" position and will not trip if a short or overload occurs. The photo to the right is a damaged breaker.
